TREASURER'S REPORT (Nick)

o Accounts Payable

A/P mostly basic overhead, training expenses to PSD, revenue from a really good training, annual fee for nonprofit registration. Pretty hefty A/P. Next month will do a deeper dive on Q1 as compared to last year. A/P of \$20,424,30 includes PSD's invoice for \$15,000 and we added an additional \$1364 profit share bonus as a thank you for the two extra students (above the cap of 20) and a job well done.

Tweaked letter on-screen during call. Executive committee revised this so hopefully the whole board can sign. Two key points: 1) We support the "regular" stretch code is implemented right away and is mandatory and that the municipal opt-in zero energy stretch code is optional. 2) We support including Embodied Carbon.

• Bills in CT: Senate 295/ House Bill 5402/ Senate Bill 292 (Nick)

Tax credit bills \$2500 for individual filer, \$5000 for filing jointly. On bill requires HERS 60, another HERS 50. Public testimony on HB 5402 is receiving public testimony today (3/16). Jonathan – HERS 60 is a very low bar. Nick – yes, it is, but we missed our chance to weigh in on SB 295. Cindy – is this new construction and/or existing homes? Jonathan – Wording in senate bill is "newly constructed home", but it's not specified in the house bill other than "purchaser or purchasers". Mike B – let's just say we support it and have the capacity to implement.

SB 292 says that fossil fuels would be disallowed in new construction once CT adopts 2024 IECC. Nick will keep the group updated.

SB 295 – Nick to look into whether there is still time for public comment.

MANUAL (Cindy)

• From GDS: In light of the recent hikes in utilities, especially here in NH, we are wondering if you would like us to conduct our review at the end of Q1 instead of waiting until Q3 this year.



Mike B thinks it's better to have a consistent time of year for updating, regardless of whether a spike is occurring. Cindy agrees it doesn't make sense to respond to spikes. Jonathan agrees. Cindy will respond to GDS to update on normal timeframe.

TRAINING COMMITTEE (Joe)

- Winter 2022 Training One of best pass rates ever
 - o 18 students in classroom component
 - 11 Certificates issued (passed all exams)
 - 4 Provisional Certificates issued (passed all exams except CAZ)
 - 3 are still working on passing the practical simulation and/or the rater exam
 - Outstanding course evaluations for both components (missing 1 for classroom)
 - Projected profit: \$15,003.60 (Profit share for PSD reduces this by \$1364)
 - Curriculum Development- committee would like Betsy to support recording of modules.
- Summer 2022 Training

 - Practical & Testing: June 27th July 1st
